SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed. Repealed.

## CHAPTER 121.

[Published March 6, 1875.]

AN ACT relating to cemeteries and cemetery associations.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. All cemetery associations and proprietors of public cemeteries, shall have authority to prevent the erection, construction or maintenance, within such cemeteries, of wooden fences, railings, or wood-  
 ed structures of any kind, or of any unsightly, of-  
 fensive or dangerous structures, head-stones, or mon-  
 uments, and may after giving reasonable notice to  
 the owner or proprietor of any cemetery lot, on  
 which the same are situated, remove or cause the  
 same to be removed, at the expense of such proprie-  
 tor. If such owner or proprietor shall be a resident  
 of the county where said cemetery is located, the  
 notice shall be personal; in any other case the notice  
 may be served by mail or by publication of such no-  
 tice for three successive weeks in a newspaper pub-  
 lished in the county where such cemetery is located,  
 or in a newspaper published in an adjoining county,  
 or at the seat of government of the state, if no  
 newspaper shall be published in the county where  
 such cemetery is located.
