

SECTION 3. And the county treasurer of Lincoln county shall collect as now provided by law, all taxes returned delinquent to him by the said town treasurers, and shall credit and pay over to the several town treasurers all of the town or local taxes so returned delinquent.

Treasurer of Lincoln county to collect delinquent taxes.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 15.

[Published February 20, 1875.]

AN ACT for the preservation of fish in the waters of Kenosha county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to kill, destroy, catch or take in any way or manner, destroy any pickerel, perch, pike, black bass, silver bass or rock bass, in any of the lakes or rivers within the county of Kenosha, or in any of the inlets or outlets of such lakes, between the first day of January and the thirtieth day of April in any year.

Unlawful to take fish at certain times.

SECTION 2. Every [any] person or persons who shall violate the provisions of the preceding section shall forfeit and suffer a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars for each fish taken, destroyed or pursued contrary to the provisions of this act, together with the costs of prosecution.

Penalty.

SECTION 3. Justices of the peace within the county of Kenosha shall have cognizance and jurisdiction of all offenses under the provisions of this act.

Justices to have cognizance.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
