

at an expense not exceeding sixty dollars per month, to be certified by the corresponding secretary and librarian of the society, and paid in the same manner as the employes in the capital. There is also appropriated to Isaac Lyon for services in the historical society for the year 1875, the sum of four hundred dollars.

Appropriation. SECTION 4. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to carry into effect sections one (1) and three (3) of this act.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 252.

[Published March 19, 1875.]

AN ACT to provide for the payment of certain expenses of district attorneys.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. In all cases in which a district attorney of any county in this state shall be required to go to any county other than that in which he lives, in order to attend to the trial of any criminal case or any civil case in which the state or county may be interested, or to do any business required to be done by him as district attorney, he shall be paid by the county of which he is an officer the full amount of his actual necessary expenses, in addition to the salary as fixed by the county board of supervisors of his county.

District attorneys to be allowed for certain expenses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.
