

CHAPTER 256.

[Published March 13, 1875.]

AN ACT appropriating to the Waupaca Agricultural and Mechanical Association one hundred dollars.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation. SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Waupaca Agricultural and Mechanical Association, out of any money in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 257.

[Published March 17, 1875.]

AN ACT to appropriate to the Governor a sum of money for the purposes therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation for relief of Michael Gough. SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the said Governor and Attorney general, to be used at their discretion out of any money in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of six hundred and thirty-nine dollars, for the relief of Michael Gough; and the State Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay said amount or so much thereof as the said Governor and Attorney General shall find to be equitably due to the said Michael Gough, on the warrant of the Secretary of State drawn in favor of the said Governor and Attorney General for the purposes mentioned in the title of this act; *provided*, that the amount so paid shall be in full of all of his claims against the state.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
