add ten per cent of the principal sum so loaned as aforesaid, and the same shall be levied and collected out of the taxable property of said county, and paid over to the state in the same way as other state taxes are collected and paid.

Duty of board of supervisors.

SECTION 3. At the time and in the manner provided for levying taxes for state and county purposes, the board of supervisors of said county of Jackson shall annually levy the amount of money required for the payment of the annual interest for the current year, and after the loan has run ten years, and not less than one-tenth of the principal sum loaned by the commissioners of school and university lands to the county board of supervisors of the county of Jackson in addition to the sum needed, for annual interest, as provided for in the preceding sections of this act.

Power of county prescribed.

SECTION 4. And it is further provided that the said county of Jackson shall never, during the period which said bonds shall remain unpaid, become indebted, or contract debts for a greater amount, including debts already contracted, as well as that herein referred to, than five per cent of the average taxable property as the same shall appear from the last two assessment rolls.

County board to file acceptance.

SECTION 5. Before contracting any debt, and before any of said funds shall be delivered to said county in exchange for said certificate of indebtedness, the county board of supervisors of said county of Jackson shall file with the secretary of state an acceptance of the provisions of this act, and of the terms and limitations herein provided for.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 18.

AN ACT authorizing the board of supervisors of the village of Elkhorn, in the county of Walworth, to sell a portion of their cemetery grounds and to improve the remainder.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authority of board of supervisors.

SECTION 1. The board of supervisors of the village of Elkhorn, in the county of Walworth, are hereby authorized to sell and convey so much of the cemetery

grounds belonging to said village as may be deemed necessary to raise money to fence and improve the re-

mainder of said grounds.

SECTION 2. The said board of supervisors are hereby consent of authorized, with the consent of the owners or occupants owners of cemof lots in said grounds, to sell and convey the whole of obtained. said grounds; the proceeds of such sale to be used in the purchase of lots in the cemetery grounds belonging to the Elkhorn Cemetery Association, called "Hazel Ridge Cemetery," and in removing the bodies of deceased persons from the old cemetery to Hazel Ridge Cemetery, or to such other places of burial us the friends of such deceased persons may require.

SECTION 3. The consent required by section two of consent of this act, of all persons residing in the county of Wal-owners to be in worth, if known, shall be in writing, and filed in the office of the village clerk, in said village of Elkhorn; and all other persons whose consent is required, and whose places of residence are unknown, and those who may reside beyond the limits of said county, shall be deemed to have given their consent unless within sixty days from the passage of this act, they shall, in writing, express their dissent.

SECTION 4. The conveyance of said grounds, or conveyance of any part thereof, shall be executed in the name of the title, etc. village of Elkhorn, and signed by the chairman of the village board of supervisors, and attested by the clerk of said village.

Section 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
