## CHAPTER 193.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named to Frank Shomer, A. W. Farrand, E. Gallagher, M. T. Battis, and J. F. Morse, as bounty for the invention of a steam road wagon, under the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the laws of 1875, chapter one hundred and eighty-two of the laws of 1876, and chapter two hundred and ninety-three of the laws of 1877.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of five thousand dollars: *provided*, the parties herein named accept the said sum in full payment of claims against the state, as a bounty to F. Shomer, A. W. Farrand, E. Gallagher, M. T. Battis, and J. F. Morse, for their disbursements and expenses incurred in the construction of a steam wagon on highways, in compliance and fulfillment of the conditions set forth in chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the laws of 1875, chapter one hundred and eighty-two of the laws of 1876, and chapter two hundred and ninety-three of the laws of 1877. But this act shall not be construed as an admission that said wagon was a satisfactory compliance with the requirements of said acts: *and provided, further*, that the amount hereby appropriated shall be absolutely in full of all claims and demands of all persons growing or in any way arising out of the acts above named or the invention or contest over the said steam wagon.

SECTION 2. Chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the laws of 1875, chapter one hundred and eighty-two of the laws of 1876, and chapter two hundred and ninety-three of the laws of 1877, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
