CHAPTER 279.

AN ACT to appropriate to Henry F. McCloskey the sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Henry F. McCloskey the sum of one hundred and fifteen (115) dollars, in full, for principal on territorial scrip issued February 19th, A. D. 1842, by an act to provide for the payment of expenses of the legislative assembly, to-wit: Numbers 778, 1285, 1320, 603, 1105, 1110, 1116, 1118, 1119, 1120, 1127, 1146, 1148, to be paid out of the general fund on delivery of said scrip to the secretary of state. Appropriation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 281.

AN ACT to provide for laying out a state road on the line between the counties of Marathon and Lincoln.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. John T. Callen and David Holinger, of Marathon county, and David Finn, of Lincoln county, are hereby appointed commissioners, and Charles Nutter as surveyor, with full power and authority to survey, lay out and establish and open a state road, commencing at the southwest corner of township number thirty-one (31) north, of range eight (8) east, and running thence easterly along the line of said counties, as far as practicable, to the eastern boundary line of said counties. Authorized to lay out a state road.
