CHAPTER 146.

AN ACT to amend section 1, of chapter 167, of the general laws of 1882, entitled, "An act to regulate the practice of pharmacy, the licensing of persons to carry on such practice, and the sale of poisons in the state of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Chapter 167, of the general laws of 1882, entitled, "An act to regulate the practice of pharmacy, the licensing of persons to carry on such practice, and the sale of poisons in the state of Wisconsin," is hereby amended by inserting the words, "except Paris green, when kept in stock, put up in pound and half pound packages," after the words, "or poisons," in the third line of section 1, so that said section 1, shall read: "That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any person, other than a registered pharmacist, to retail, compound or dispense drugs, medicines or poisons, except Paris green, when kept in stock, put up in pound and half pound packages, or to institute or conduct any pharmacy, store or shop for retailing, compounding or dispensing drugs, medicines or poisons, unless such person shall be a registered pharmacist, or shall employ and place in charge of such pharmacy, store or shop, a registered pharmacist, within the full meaning of this act, except as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
