CHAPTER 361.

AN ACT to prevent the manufacture and sale of oleaginous substances, or compounds of the same, in imitation of the pure dairy products, and to repeal sections 1 and 3, of chapter 40, of the laws of 1881.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Whoever manufactures out of any oleaginous substances, or any compound of the same, other than that produced from unadulterated milk, or cream from the same, any article designed to take the place of butter or cheese, produced from pure, unadulterated milk, or cream of the same; or whoever shall knowingly sell, or offer for sale, the same as an article of food, shall, on conviction thereof, be confined in the county jail not exceeding one year or fined not exceeding one thousand dollars, or both.

Penalty for manufacturing spurious butter.

SECTION 2. Sections 1 and 3, of chapter 40, of the laws of 1881, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 362.

AN ACT detaching certain property in the town of Madison, Dane county, and making it a part of the fourth ward of the city of Madison for school purposes only.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The property of Amos Barnes, including his dwelling house and not to exceed ten acres of land located in the northeast quarter of section 26, town of Madison, is hereby detached

Property of Amos Barnes, to be a part of fourth ward for school purposes only.
