CHAPTER 445.

AN ACT to facilitate the sale of certain state lands therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The commissioners of the public lands are hereby authorized and empowered to sell, for a sum not less than forty dollars each, lots three and four, and for a sum not less than twenty-five dollars each, lots eleven and twelve, situate in block thirty-seven, McFarlane, Dunn and Armstrong's addition to the city of Portage, on such terms as other state lands are sold.

Sale of certain lands authorized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 446.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named, to pay for chaplain services in the legislature for the year 1885.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of fifteen dollars for each and every clergyman officiating as chaplain for the legislature of 1885; provided, that such chaplain shall have performed such service for one week.

Payment of chaplains authorized.

SECTION 2. The chief clerks of the senate and assembly shall certify to the secretary of state, the names of the several clergymen who have officiated as chaplain during the session of 1885, as provided in section 1, of this act, whereupon the
