

said dam, of the common law remedy by action for damages for such injury against the owners of said dam.

SECTION 5. The said William Wilson, Amos E. Jefferson and Charles T. Fox, or their heirs or assigns, for the purpose of acquiring the flowage rights that they may deem necessary in carrying out the provisions of this act, may exercise all the powers granted to corporations by section 1777, of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 318, of the laws of 1882.

May exercise powers granted by section 1777, R. S.

SECTION 6. The right to amend and repeal this act is hereby reserved. All acts and parts of acts so far as they conflict with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Right to amend or repeal, reserved.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to the persons therein named for expenses incurred as legislative visiting committee to state institutions.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for expenses incurred as visiting committee of the legislature for 1887, to state institutions, to Edward I. Kidd, James W. Perkins and Fred C. Schuler, the sum of one hundred dollars each.

Appropriation to legislative visiting committee.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force on and after its passage and publication.
