CHAPTER 499.

AN ACT relating to the manner of conducting elections.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any clerk or inspector of elections to issue or write, change or alter, for any person on the day of any election any ticket or ballot, and any such officer who shall violate the foregoing provisions, or who shall mark any ballot or ticket except as provided by law, or who shall disclose how any elector shall have voted, unless required to do so as a witness in a judicial proceeding, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Clerk or inspector not to issue or write, change or alter any ticket or ballot on election day, or disclose how elector voted, unless required to do so as a witness in judicial proceeding—penalty.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
