CHAPTER 501.

AN ACT increasing the per diem pay of certain legislative clerks during the session of 1887.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The per diem pay of the two assistant transcribing clerks of the senate; the two assistant transcribing clerks of the assembly; one assistant engrossing clerk of the senate; one assistant engrossing clerk of the assembly; one assistant enrolling clerk of the assembly; two comparing clerks on engrossed bills of the senate; and two similar clerks of the assembly; and one endorsement clerk on engrossed bills of the assembly; and the doorkeepers, committee-room attendants, gallery attendants, night-watchmen, and wash-room attendants, janitor of the senate and assembly; and flagman of the assembly, and the custodians of the enrolling and engrossing rooms of the senate and assembly, shall be three dollars and fifty cents per day for and during the session of 1887 only. That the chief clerks of each house shall certify to the secretary of state the names of the clerks so employed. And there is hereby appropriated a sufficient sum of money out of the state treasury to pay this additional compensation to such clerks.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
