The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Provisions of chap. 296, laws 1885, made applicable to the town of Superior, Douglas county.

SECTION 1. In the application of the provisions of chapter 296, of the laws of 1885, to said town of Superior, said town shall be deemed and taken to have had within its boundary, at the time of the taking of the last enumeration of the inhabitants by the state, an unincorporated village with a population of more than five hundred.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 98.

AN ACT to facilitate the sale of state swamp lands in Crawford county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorizing sale of swamp land in Crawford county.

SECTION 1. The commissioners of the public lands are hereby authorized and required to offer for sale the swamp lands held by the state in the county of Crawford, at a minimum price of one dollar and fifty cents per acre.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
