SECTION 2. Section 5, of chapter 291, of the laws of 1880, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 5. This act shall apply to the action or decision of any county board made or taken during the year 1888, as well as to future actions or decisions, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 202.

AN ACT to authorize the city of Milwaukee to pension widows and children of members of the fire and police departments.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Milwaukee is hereby authorized to pay annually to the widow and children and dependent widowed mother of any member of the fire or police departments of said city, who have been killed since the first day of February, 1889, or who may hereafter be killed in the actual discharge of his duties, such sum of money as a pension for such time as it may deem proper; such sum not to exceed one-half of the annual salary drawn by said member; provided, that such pension shall cease upon the remarriage of said widow or upon other cessation of dependency of such children or widowed mother.

Authorizing city of Milwaukee to pension widows and children of members of fire and police departments.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage and publication.
