CHAPTER 228.

AN ACT to amend section 2, of chapter 202, of the general laws of 1881, entitled, "An act to amend section 1, of chapter 266, of the general laws of 1880, entitled, 'An act to repeal sections 592 and 594, of the revised statutes of 1878, relating to public charities, and to amend section 593, revised statutes of 1878, and to prescribe the procedure for committing persons to the insane hospitals.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2, of chapter 202, of the general laws of 1881, is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section 2, the following, viz.: 30. If you say yes, to the preceding question, then state your opinion whether the person named in this report should be committed to a hospital for treatment, or to the county asylum. If, upon the receipt of the report of the examining physicians, the judge shall find and adjudge the person therein named insane, he may commit such insane person either to the state hospital for the district to which the county belongs, or to the county asylum for the county, and the superintendents of such institutions will receive all persons so committed.

Amending sec. 2, ch. 202, laws 1881, relating to commitment of insane persons.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
