CHAPTER 323.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the city of Milwaukee relating to the compensation of the tax commissioner.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The salary of the tax commissioner of the city of Milwaukee is hereby fixed at twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500) per annum. Amend charter of Milwaukee. Salary of tax commissioner.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 324.

AN ACT to amend chapter 545, of the laws of 1887, entitled, "an act to amend chapter 120, of the laws of 1879, entitled, an act to incorporate the city of Ahnapee," and the several acts amendatory thereof.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1, of chapter 545, of the laws of 1887, is hereby amended as follows: By striking out the words and figures "A. D. 1879," where they occur in the third line of section 1, of said chapter 1, of said act, and inserting and substituting in the place thereof, the words and figures "A. D. 1887." Amending ch. 1, ch. 545, laws 1887. Change figures.

SECTION 2. The said act is further amended by adding thereto the following: On or before the twentieth day of May in each year the clerk shall Poll tax.

make a list of the names of all male persons over the age of twenty-one and under the age of fifty years, with the amount of their poll tax, which shall be one dollar and twenty-five cents, set opposite of each person's name, and submit the same to the common council for correction; when such list is corrected, and on or before the first day of June in each year, the council shall by order or resolution (to be signed by the mayor and clerk), and annexed thereto, direct the same to be delivered to the street commissioner for collection. The street commissioner shall forthwith demand the same once of each person named in the list, and if any person neglects to pay the same for ten days thereafter, then such street commissioner shall, in the name of the city, sue for and collect such tax with fifty per cent. damages on the same with costs of suit, before the police justice of the city, and in default of payment of such judgment, execution shall issue against the defendant as in cases of tort, and the first process in such action shall be by civil warrant; provided, that the common council may, by resolution, cause the said poll list to be placed in the hands of the street commissioner to be collected in money or labor. And the street commissioner shall have authority to collect and receipt for such tax and shall pay over all moneys so collected by him to the city treasurer. The common council may exempt from payment of such tax all persons belonging to any fire or hook and ladder company, or any person who is poor or disabled, when they deem it proper to do so, and the street commissioner, while the said list in his hands for collection, may put upon the same the names of all persons liable to such tax as may have been omitted therefrom, who shall be liable the same as if their names were originally placed in said list.

Amend ch. 3.

SECTION 3. Chapter 3, of said act is hereby amended by striking out the word, freeholders where it occurs in the eleventh line of section 3, of said chapter 3, and by adding the word, freeholders, after the word, voters, where it occurs in the thirteenth line of said section 3.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
