## CHAPTER 369.

AN ACT to amend section 1, of chapter 471, of the laws of 1885, relating to the catching of brook trout.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Amending ch.

SECTION 1. Section 1, of chapter 471, of the laws of 1885, is hereby amended by striking out the words, "provided, however, that the provisions of this act shall not extend to or affect the counties of Ashland, Bayfield, Douglas, Polk, Pierce or Burnett," so that said section, when so amended, shall read as follows: Section 1. Any person who shall catch for sale or offer for sale or barter, any brook trout caught in any of the streams, ponds or lakes of this state, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars, and upon conviction for a second violation of the provisions of this act, shall be punishable by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than twenty dollars; provided, that this act shall not prohibit the catching, for sale or barter, brook trout, raised and propagated in any of the streams or ponds of this state, by the owners thereof or their agents.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
