

hereafter for and by the female students attending said university, and not otherwise.

SECTION 2. The regents of the university are hereby authorized and directed to employ a competent preceptress, who shall have charge and general supervision of said Ladies' hall, under the direction and regulations of the said regents, at a salary of not more than fifteen hundred dollars per annum; provided, that said preceptress shall perform such duties and teach such classes as said regents may from time to time require.

Regents may employ preceptress to manage same, salary.

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated, for the purpose of properly heating and lighting, as hereinbefore provided, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five thousand dollars.

CHAPTER 417.

AN ACT authorizing the governor to designate a day to be known as "arbor day."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The governor is hereby authorized to set apart by proclamation one day in each year, to be observed as tree planting or arbor day, requesting all public schools and colleges to observe the same by suitable exercises, having for their object the imparting of knowledge of horticulture, in the department known as arboriculture, and the adornment of schools and public grounds.

Arbor day, governor to designate.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
