CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT relating to street railways in the city of Eau Claire, and legalizing the ordinance heretofore passed by the common council of said city, and approved by the mayor thereof, authorizing the use of electrical or animal power on street railways in the said city.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The ordinance entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the Eau Claire Street Railway company to operate its street railway lines in the city of Eau Claire by electrical or animal power," passed by the common council of said city and approved by the mayor thereof, on October 18, 1888, and afterwards accepted by said railway company, is hereby declared to be valid and is hereby in all respects legalized and confirmed as an ordinance of said city; and such ordinance may be recorded in the office of the register of deeds of Eau Claire county, and it or the record thereof shall have full force and effect, as an ordinance of said city, and shall be received in all courts and places as sufficient evidence of all facts therein stated; and of the lawful authority of said common council to pass, and of the said mayor to approve the same, notwithstanding, the said city by its charter might not have been authorized to grant the said franchise.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
