CHAPTER 218.

AN ACT to provide for the punishment of owners of vicious dogs.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. If any dog shall worry, wound or kill any horse, cattle, sheep or lamb, and verbal or written notice of such fact be given to the owner or keeper of such dog, then if such dog shall, after such notice so given to said owner, again worry, wound or kill any horse, cattle, sheep or lamb, the owner or keeper of such dog shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars and the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such fine and costs, shall be committed to the county jail until such fine and costs be paid, not exceeding twenty days.

Owners of dogs made liable for injuries committed by dog. Penalty.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 219.
