CHAPTER 434.

AN ACT to forbid the sale of tobacco to minors, contrary to the order of their parents.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. No person shall sell or give to any minor, any cigar, cigarette or tobacco, when such person has been forbidden by the parent or guardian of such minor, to sell or give the same to such minor.

Cigars, cigarettes and tobacco not to be sold to minors.

SECTION 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than ten and not more than twenty five dollars.

Penalty.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 435.

AN ACT to protect the fish in Sturgeon bay.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful after the passage of this act, for any person, for himself or another, to set in the waters of Sturgeon bay, any pound, gill, seine, fyke or trap net, or to use any spear therein. The waters of Sturgeon bay shall be considered and construed to mean that body of water lying south of a line drawn from the extreme easterly point of Sherwood's point, in the town of Nasewaupée, in Door county; said line running northeasterly to the shore, terminating

Nets, etc., not to be used in Sturgeon Bay.
