## CHAPTER 144.

AN ACT to amend section 1444, of the Revised Statutes, relating to cemeteries.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 1444, of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 1444. The annual election for trustees to supply the place of those whose term of office expires, shall be held on the day mentioned in such certificate, at such place as the trustees shall direct, within the same county. The trustees chosen at any election after the first, shall be proprietors of lots in such cemetery, and shall hold their offices for three years, and until their successors shall be chosen. Such election shall be by ballot, and every person who shall be the owner of one or more lots in the cemetery of the association shall be entitled to one vote; and if there be more than one owner of any one lot, then such one of such owners as the majority of the joint owners shall designate shall cast the vote, and a plurality shall elect. But no person shall hereafter be elected to hold the office of such trustee, unless he is a resident of this state. Public notice of the annual election shall be given in such manner as the by-laws of the association shall prescribe.
