CHAPTER 189.

AN ACT to prevent the discharge of filth or sewage into Geneva lake, in the county of Walworth.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who shall build, keep or maintain any sewer, ditch or drain, by means whereof the filth or sewage from any dwelling house, stable, privy, cesspool, camp, hotel, club house or boarding house shall be conveyed to or discharged into Geneva lake, in the county of Walworth; and any person who shall in any manner whatsoever, place, deposit, empty or discharge the filth or sewage from any such dwelling house, stable, privy, cesspool, camp, hotel, club house or boarding house, into said lake, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Filth, etc., not to be discharged into Geneva lake.

SECTION 2. Every person convicted of a violation of section 1, of this act, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, nor less than ten dollars.

Penalty.

SECTION 3. Where a ditch, drain or sewer shall be or heretofore shall have been dug, made or constructed for any purpose prohibited by section 1, of this act, the person keeping or maintaining the same shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day such ditch, drain or sewer shall be so maintained and used in violation of this act.

Maintenance of sewer, etc., a misdemeanor.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
