## CHAPTER 302.

AN ACT to limit passenger rates on certain  
railroads in the state of Wisconsin.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in  
senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Railroad fare  
not to exceed  
three cents per  
mile where  
gross receipts  
exceed \$3,500  
per mile.

SECTION 1. Every railroad corporation operating a railroad in this state, the gross receipts of which are or exceed three thousand five hundred dollars per mile per annum, shall not demand, collect or receive a greater compensation for the transportation of persons than three cents per mile, and shall keep and sell at their ticket stations, within this state, on their respective lines of roads, tickets at a price not to exceed three cents per mile; but no railroad corporation shall be compelled to accept a single fare for less than five cents.

Repealing  
clause.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts so far as they conflict with the provision of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
