CHAPTER 322.

AN ACT to authorize the county of Marinette, in conjunction with the proper authorities of Michigan, to build and maintain a bridge across the Menominee river.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authority granted to build a bridge across the Menominee river.

SECTION 1. That in conjunction with the county of Dickinson, in the state of Michigan, the county of Marinette, Wisconsin, is hereby authorized to construct and maintain a bridge across the Menominee river from some point on section seventeen or twenty, or on section twenty-one, in township thirty-eight north, of range twenty-one east, in Wisconsin, to some point on section twenty, or section twenty-one, in township thirty-nine north, of range twenty-nine west, in Michigan, and to enter into a contract with said county of Dickinson, Michigan, for the construction and maintenance of said bridge.

Part of cost to be paid by the county board.

SECTION 2. The board of supervisors of said county of Marinette, shall appropriate and pay from the proper fund of said county, such part of the cost of building and maintaining said bridge as shall be provided to be paid by said county of Marinette, in and by the contract for the construction and maintenance of said bridge mentioned in the first section of this act, when in their judgment the construction of such bridge shall be necessary.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
