CHAPTER 22.

AN ACT to change and regulate the time of holding terms of court in the superior court of Milwaukee county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The terms of the superior court of Milwaukee county, Wisconsin, shall be three in number for each year the commencement of said terms to be as follows, to-wit: on the first Monday of January; on the first Monday of April, and on the second Monday of September in each year.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 23.

AN ACT to amend section 5 of chapter 125 of the laws of 1887 as amended by section 5 of chapter 67 of the laws of 1891, relating to the superior court of Milwaukee county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 125 of the laws of 1887 as amended by section 5 of chapter

Clerk of superior court to appoint additional clerks.

Salary of deputies and extra clerks.

67 of the laws of 1891 is hereby amended by striking out of said section 5 the words following, to-wit: "Said clerk shall appoint a deputy clerk in addition to those now authorized by law, who shall receive a salary of one thousand dollars per annum to be paid quarterly out of the treasury of said county" and insert in lieu thereof the following: "Said clerk shall appoint two deputy clerks in addition to those now authorized by law who shall receive a salary of one thousand dollars per annum each, and two entry clerks who shall receive a salary of eight hundred dollars per annum each, and one custodian who shall receive a salary of one thousand dollars per annum, and one stenographer who shall receive a salary of five hundred dollars per annum, each of said salaries to be paid quarterly out of the treasury of said county. So that said section when amended shall read as follows: Section 5. The clerk of the circuit court of Milwaukee county shall be ex-officio clerk of said superior court, and shall under the direction of the judge of said court provide a seal therefor. Said clerk shall appoint two deputy clerks in addition to those now authorized by law, who shall receive a salary of one thousand dollars per annum each, and two entry clerks who shall receive a salary of eight hundred dollars per annum each, and one custodian who shall receive a salary of one thousand dollars per annum and one stenographer who shall receive a salary of five hundred dollars per annum; each of said salaries to be paid quarterly out of the treasury of said county.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
