CHAPTER 49.

AN ACT to amend section 2450 of chapter 114, of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898, relating to county courts.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2450 of chapter 114 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898, is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section the following words: whenever any county judge, pursuant to this section, shall hold court in any county other than that for which he was elected, he shall receive his actual expenses to be audited and paid by the county board of the county in which he so holds court.

County judge allowed actual expenses when holding court in other than own county.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 50.

AN ACT to amend section 1059 of the statutes of 1898, relating to the assessment of real and personal property.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1059 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the word "real" in the first line the words "or personal"

Both real and personal property when omitted from assessment, to be entered for each omission.

so that the said section shall read as follows: Section 1059. Real or personal property omitted from assessment in any of the three next previous years by mistake or inadvertance, unless previously re-assessed for the same year or years, shall be entered once additionally for each previous year of such omission, designating each such additional entry as omitted for the year 18.. (giving year of omission) and affixing a just valuation to each entry for a former year as the same should then have been assessed according to his best judgment, and taxes shall be apportioned and collected on the tax roll for such entry.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 51.

AN ACT to amend section 926 of the statutes of 1898, relating to cities under special charters.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Street commissioner may be elected by council instead of by people.

SECTION 1. Section 926 of the statutes of 1898, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "such special charter," in the twenty-eighth line of said section, the words "and shall have power to provide for and change the manner of electing a street commissioner, so that such officer may be elected by the council, instead of by the people."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
