

Wisconsin Session Laws, 1911.

CHAPTER 1.

AN ACT relating to the securing of expert help for the joint committee on finance, and making an appropriation therefor.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The joint committee on finance of the legislature for the session of 1911 is empowered to employ trained experts in accounting and statistics and in the formulation of public financial statements. Such expert help shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter 363 of the laws of 1905, and its amendments.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of the general fund not to exceed twenty-five hundred dollars, the same to be paid upon the approval and order of the chairmen of the senate and assembly division of the joint committee on finance, respectively.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 2.

AN ACT to authorize the Menasha Wooden Ware Company, its successors and assigns, to construct and maintain a bridge across the Flambeau river, in the city of Ladysmith, Rusk county.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The Menasha Wooden Ware Company, its successors and assigns, is authorized to construct and maintain a free foot and wagon bridge over and across the Flambeau river,
