CHAPTER 318.

AN ACT to amend section 4767 of the statutes, relating to breaches of recognizance in criminal cases.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 4767 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 4767. In case of the breach of any recognizance entered into in a criminal case the same shall be certified and returned to the circuit court, to be proceeded upon according to law; and a rearrest may be had as provided in section 4784 of the statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 319.

AN ACT to amend section 959m—1 of the statutes, relating to flushing, sprinkling, and cleaning of streets, and other public work, in cities of the second, third and fourth classes and incorporated villages.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 959m—1 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 959m—1. The common council of all cities of the second, third and fourth classes and the board of trustees of any incorporated village, whether operating under special or general charter, may, by resolution or ordinance, direct that the streets or any certain streets, or portions of streets shall be flushed, watered or sprinkled with water, oil or solution in whole or in part, during the current year, and that such flushing and sprinkling and the cleaning of streets and such other public work as may be determined upon, shall be performed by the city or village under the direction of the board of public works, or such person or body performing the duties of such board.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
