## CHAPTER 7.

AN ACT to validate proceedings heretofore taken for the creation of towns under the provisions of sections 775a, 775b, 775c and 775d of the statutes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Proceedings heretofore taken for the creation of any new town under the provisions of sections 775a, 775b, 775c and 775d of the statutes, where the requirements of said sections have been substantially complied with, except that the territory embraced in such new town exceeds a government township; provided, that such territory is contiguous, and provided further that the findings of fact and order of the court creating such new town shall have been made and filed on or before March 20th, 1913, be and such proceedings are hereby validated and such new town so created is hereby declared to be a lawfully created town.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 8.

AN ACT to amend subsection 2 of section 26 of the statutes, relating to registration of voters.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection 2 of section 26 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 26.) 2. They shall put thereon the names of all persons residing in their election district appearing on the poll lists kept at the last preceding general and municipal elections, and may take therefor such lists from the office where kept, omitting therefrom the names of such as have died or removed from the district, and adding the names of all persons known to them to be electors therein, except that at the meetings of the board of inspectors held immediately preceding the first election requiring registration, after the first day of December, 1912, in cities of the second, third and fourth classes, and villages and towns in which registry is required, such inspectors shall make a new registry of electors for such election,

\* \* and shall place thereon the names of all persons resid-

ing in their election district known by them to be qualified elec-

tors and the names of all electors who appear in person or through a responsible elector of the voting precinct known to said inspectors, request that their names be placed on such registry. Such inspectors shall hold their first meeting on Monday and the following Tuesday three weeks preceding such election; their second meeting on primary election day and the following Tuesday preceding such election.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT to create section 495—6m of the statutes, relating to dissolution of union free high school districts.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 495—6m. When any union free high school is established and organized, such union free high school district shall not be dissolved nor shall its certificate of organization be surrendered within four years from the date when such district was established and organized.

AN ACT to detach certain territory from the town of Saxon, in Iron county, to create the town of Kimball, and to provide for town meetings therein, and for a final settlement between said towns.

All that tract of country heretofore constituting a part of the town of Saxon, lying and being in the county of Iron and state of Wisconsin, and known and described as follows, to wit: All of fractional sections thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, twenty-two, twenty-four, twenty-five, and all of sections twenty-three, twenty-six, twenty-seven, thirty-four, thirty-five,
