

any money in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the university fund income to be used by the board of regents of the university for the construction and equipment of certain buildings and permanent improvements within the amounts set forth as follows:

Wing to agricultural soils building, twenty-eight thousand dollars;

Water softener and other permanent improvements at the central heating station, five thousand dollars;

Medical or physics building, one hundred and ten thousand dollars;

Equipment for buildings, eighty-two thousand dollars.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 627.

AN ACT to amend subsection 1 and to create subsection 3 of section 172—16 of the statutes, making appropriations for the tax commission.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 1 of section 172—16 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 172—16.) 1. There is annually appropriated, beginning July 1, * * * 1915, one hundred * * * seventy-five thousand * * * dollars, payable from any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, for the tax commission to carry into effect the powers, duties and functions provided by law for said commission *other than reassessments and review of assessment proceedings.*

SECTION 2. There is added to section 172—16 of the statutes a new subsection to be numbered and to read: (Section 172—16.) 3. There is annually appropriated such sums as may be necessary, payable from any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, for the tax commission to carry on the work of reassessments and review of assessment proceedings.

SECTION 3. Of the balance of the appropriation, heretofore provided in subsection 1 of section 172—16, which remained unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 1915, five thousand dollars shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect as of July 1, 1915.
