## CHAPTER 254

AN ACT to renumber section 663 of the statutes to be subsection 1 of said section, and to create subsection 2 of section 663 of the statutes, relating to supervisors.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 663 of the statutes is renumbered to be subsection 1 of said section.

SECTION 2. A new subsection is added to section 663 of the statutes to read: (Section 663) 2. Such board of supervisors may at its annual November meeting provide by resolution that, at the election to be held in each city and village on the first Tuesday of April following the adoption of such resolution, such supervisor shall be elected for a term of three years, and at the annual town meeting held on the first Tuesday of April following the adoption of such resolution, three supervisors shall be elected, one for a term of one year, one for a term of two years, and the supervisor, designated on the ballot as chairman, for a term of three years, and thereafter at each annual town meeting a supervisor shall be elected for a term of three years. In case such resolution is adopted, a supervisor elected to succeed the chairman shall be designated and elected as chairman, and, in case any supervisor is elected in a year when his term as supervisor has not expired, his office as supervisor shall become vacant on the tenth day following his election as chairman and shall be filled as provided by law.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 255

AN ACT to create section 926—180 of the statutes, relating to the disposal of garbage in cities of the first class.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to be numbered and to read: Section 926—180. Every city of the first class in this state, whether organized under special or general law, is hereby authorized to provide for the disposal of the garbage of such city by the reduction process, or otherwise, and to sell and dispose of the products obtained in the process of

garbage disposal or reduction in such manner as such city may determine; and every such city is hereby authorized to incur indebtedness and to issue bonds in the manner provided by law for the erection and maintenance of garbage reduction or disposal plants. This act shall be liberally construed in favor of the city exercising the powers herein granted, and shall not be construed as a limitation upon any powers now possessed by any such city.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 256

AN ACT to permit the building of a bridge across the north fork of the Flambeau river.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The Flambeau Paper Company is, and its successors and assigns are, hereby authorized and empowered to construct and maintain a bridge over and across the north fork of the Flambeau river in the city of Park Falls, Price county, Wisconsin, at any point from the east bank of said river in section twenty-four, township forty north, range one west, to the opposite bank thereof in said section twenty-four for use in connection with and in the operation of a railway side track and switch by said Flambeau Paper Company, its successors and assigns, and its and their lessees and licensees; to that end it and they are hereby authorized and empowered to erect piers, drive piles, sink cribs and to build embankments and approaches in said river and on the banks thereof, and to do all things else that may be necessary or requisite for the proper and convenient construction and maintenance of said bridge.

SECTION 2. Such bridge shall be constructed at such height above water level and in such manner as not unnecessarily or materially to obstruct or hinder the flow of water or unnecessarily to impede navigation for logs, lumber, and rafts on such river, and so as to permit the passage of row boats and other similar small water craft.

SECTION 3. Such bridge so constructed shall be deemed a lawful structure, and said Flambeau Paper Company, and its successors and assigns and lessees and licensees are authorized and empowered to keep, maintain, replace and repair the same whenever necessary.
