

or more persons shall keep a record of all accidents causing death or disability of any employe, which record shall show such facts in regard to the accident and the person disabled as the industrial board may require; said record to be kept in a book in such form as the industrial accident board may prescribe.

CHAPTER 667

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 51.29 of the statutes, relating to the apportionment of taxes of street railway and conservation and regulation companies.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 51.29 of the statutes is amended to read: (51.29) (1) The state shall retain fifteen per cent of the taxes paid into the treasury by any street railway company or conservation and regulation company defined by section 51.02, and * * * *twenty per cent of such taxes shall be distributed to the counties and sixty-five per cent shall be distributed to the towns, cities and villages, within or through which the business of such company was carried on and operated in proportion, as near as may be, to the property located and business transacted within each such town, city and village; provided, however, that in determining the amount of business transacted, receipts derived from current delivered at wholesale to another utility shall not be taken into consideration in determining such proportion.* Also all taxes paid by any company defined by section 51.02 derived from or apportionable to docks, piers, wharves or grain elevators and their approaches and appurtenances, on the basis of the separate valuation provided for in section 51.08 shall be distributed to the towns, cities and villages in which they are located.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
