CHAPTER 320.

AN ACT to create two paragraphs of subsection (5) of section 20.17 of the statutes, relating to the School for the Deaf, and making appropriations.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to subsection (5) of section 20.17 of the statutes, two new paragraphs to be numbered and to read: (20.17) (5) (f) On July 1, 1919, two thousand one hundred dollars, for the construction of coal shed; and on July 1, 1920, twenty-one thousand six hundred dollars, for the construction of a new hospital; eight thousand dollars, for the construction of a laundry; three thousand dollars for laundry equipment; and two thousand dollars, for sidewalks.

(g) On July 1, 1919, nineteen thousand dollars, and on July 1, 1920, seventeen thousand three hundred dollars, for property repairs and maintenance.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon July 1, 1919.

CHAPTER 321.

AN ACT to create a new paragraph of subsection (4) of section 20.17 of the statutes, relating to the Central State Hospital for the Insane, and making appropriations.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to subsection (4) of section 20.17 of the statutes, a new paragraph to be numbered and to read: (20.17) (4) (e) On July 1, 1919, twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars, for the construction of a dining room and kitchen building; and twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars, for the construction of ward buildings; and on July 1, 1920, twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars, for the construction of the dining room and kitchen building; twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars, for the construction of ward buildings, and three thousand five hundred dollars, for furniture and furnishings.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon July 1, 1919.
