### CHAPTER 445.

AN ACT to repeal balance remaining in the appropriation made by chapter 547, laws of 1921, relating to the national dairy show; any balance remaining in the appropriation made by chapter 468, laws of 1919, relating to an appropriation to the executive department for printing histories of the thirty-second division; and balance in the appropriation made by subsection (6) of section 20.02, relating to the commissioners on uniformity of legislation; and any balance remaining in the appropriation made by subsection (3) of section 20.05 of the statutes, relating to filing equipment in the office of the state treasury; and paragraph (af) of subsection (11) of section 20.38 of the statutes, relating to the Whitewater state normal school; to renumber subsection (15) of section 20.20 of the statutes (as created by chapter 129, laws of 1925) to be section 20.207 of the statutes; to amend paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 20.05, relating to the assistant state treasurer; subsection (1) of section 20.11, relating to the salary of the editor of publications of the printing board; subsection (2) of section 20.61, relating to the appropriation for the state horticultural society; subsection (3) of section 20.63, relating to permanent property for the state library; subsection (4) of section 20.73, relating to the purchase of automobiles; paragraph (1) of subsection (lm) of section 27.01, relating to a revolving fund for the conservation commission; subsection (1) of section 35.02; subsection (6) of section 27.01, relating to a revolving fund for the conservation commission; section 24.075 of the statutes (as created by Chapter 206, Laws of 1925); and section 20.48 and subsections (6) and (15) of section 169.01 of the statutes, relating to the state athletic commission; and to create subsection (8) of section 20.61, relating to state aid for the central Wisconsin cheesemakers', buttermakers' and dairy-men's advancement association; subsection (4) to section

20.19, relating to an appropriation to the commissioners of public lands; section 20.051, relating to the state treasurer; subsection (6a) to section 20.20 of the statutes, relating to appropriations from the conservation fund for carrying out the provisions of section 24.075 of the statutes; subsection (9) to section 20.20, relating to a revolving fund for the conservation commission; paragraph (j) to subsection (2) of section 20.38, relating to the state board of normal regents; paragraph (af) to subsection (11) of section 20.38, relating to the Whitewater state normal school; and section 20.712 of the statutes, relating to an appropriation to the state civil service commission; and to authorize the prohibition commissioner to pay a bill for supplies heretofore incurred, and making appropriations; and making an appropriation to the senate for the expenses incurred by the special committees created by senate resolutions No. 20 and No. 25.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Any balances remaining on June 30, 1925, in the appropriations made by chapter 547, laws of 1921, relating to the cost of an exhibit at the national dairy show; by chapter 468, laws of 1919, relating to an appropriation to the contingent fund of the governor for printing histories for the thirty-second division; by subsection (6) of section 20.02 of the statutes, relating to the commissioners on uniformity of legislation; by subsection (3) of section 20.05 of the statutes, relating to the purchase of filing equipment for the office of the state treasury; and paragraph (af) of subsection (11) of section 20.38, are repealed.

SECTION 2. Subsection (15) of section 20.20 of the statutes (as created by chapter 129, laws of 1925) is renumbered to be section 20.207 of the statutes.

SECTION 3. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 20.05; subsection (1) of section 20.11; subsection (2) of section 20.61; subsection (3) of section 20.63; subsection (4) of section 20.73; paragraph (1) of subsection (1m) of section 27.01; subsection (1) of section 35.02; subsection (6) of section 27.01; section 24.075 of the statutes (as created by Chapter 206, Laws of 1925); and section 20.48 and subsections (6) and (15) of section 169.01 of the statutes, are amended to read: (20.05) (1) (b) To the assistant state treasurer an annual salary of three thousand *six hundred* dollars.

(20.11) (1) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, thirteen thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars, for the administration expenses of said board. Of this there is allotted to the editor of publications an annual salary of \* \* \* *three thousand* \* \* \* dollars.

(20.61) (2) Annually, beginning July 1, 1913, nine thousand dollars to the Wisconsin state horticultural society, for the execution of its functions as provided in sections 93.08 and 93.09; and all moneys received by each and every person for or in behalf of said society shall be paid within one week after receipt into the general fund, and are appropriated therefrom and added to this appropriation. \* \* \*

(20.63) (3) On July 1, 1923, three thousand eight hundred dollars for the purchase of library stacks and shelving *and permanent property* for the state library. Expenditures from this appropriation shall be certified to the secretary of state by the state librarian and the state chief engineer.

(20.73) (4) No automobile shall be purchased for any department, board, commission, or institution of the state, without specific statutory authority therefor or the \* \* \* *approval of the governor, the secretary of state, and the state treasurer.* \* \* \*

(Chapter 104, Laws of 1925) (27.01) (1m) (1) Said commission is authorized to remove or cause to be removed in such manner as it may deem advisable wood, timber, rocks, stone, earth, or other products from said parks and sell the same to the highest bidder, or lease parts or parcels of state park lands or properties, or grant franchises or concessions; and pay the proceeds into the state treasury to the credit of the \* \* \* *conservation fund, \* \* \* and are appropriated therefrom to be used by the commission for the purchase of state park lands and for the purchase, construction, improvement and maintenance of state park buildings or for the improvement of state park grounds, all subject to the approval of the governor.*

(35.02) (1) The governor and the superintendent of public property, ex officio, and an editor of public printing, who shall be appointed by the governor, shall constitute the printing board. The editor of public printing shall hold his office for the term of two years, and shall receive \* \* \* *the annual salary \* \* \* fixed by law,* and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties.

(27.01 (6) The commission is authorized to operate portable launches on Devils Lake at the Devils Lake State Park necessary for the proper service of the people in the state parks, and to that end may fix prices for such services sufficient to make them self-supporting. All moneys arising from such activities shall be paid into the *conservation fund of the state treasury* within one week, and are appropriated as revolving appropriations to carry on the above-mentioned activities.

24.075 (as created by Chapter 206, Laws of 1925) For the purpose of blocking up state-owned lands for forests, park, game refuges or other similar purposes, into units capable of being administered and protected, exchange of such lands is hereby authorized. The word "exchange" as used herein shall include the right to purchase lands without conveyance of any lands in exchange therefor, provided the total amount to be paid upon all purchases hereunder shall not exceed five thousand dollars during any fiscal year. Any such exchanges shall first be approved by the governor, the land commissioners and the conservation commission. The provisions of this section shall be applicable to all lands defined and classified under this chapter, including state forest lands, unless otherwise specified. All such exchanges shall be determined on the basis of equal values and negotiated in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. The integrity of the respective trust funds or other funds shall be maintained in executing any transaction authorized under this section. \* \* \* This section shall not authorize the exchange or sale of any lands within eighty rods of any lake, nor shall this section authorize any exchange, sale or purchase after July 1, 1927.

20.48 All license fees or taxes received by the state athletic commission shall be paid within one week after receipt into the general fund, and \* \* \* *eleven thousand* \* \* \* dollars of such receipts is appropriated, annually, for salaries and expenses of said commission. Of this there is allotted:

(1) To each member of the commission compensation of five dollars per diem for each day actually spent in the performance of his official duties; but not exceeding an aggregate of \* \* \* *three thousand* dollars annually for all of the members.

(2) To the secretary of the commission such salary as shall be fixed by the commission, not exceeding two thousand dollars.

(169.01) (6) The commission shall make to the legislature a full report of its proceedings for the two years ending with the \* \* \* *thirtieth day of \* \* \* June of each even-numbered year*, before the beginning of the regular session of the legislature; said report to the legislature shall be completed and shall contain a statement of clubs, organizations or corporations, the number of licenses revoked, the gross receipts from each club, organization or corporation, and such other information and comments in relation to the work of the commission as the public interest may require.

(15) Each contestant must be examined prior to entering the ring by a physician who has been licensed to practice in Wisconsin for not less than five years; such physician to be appointed by the commission. The physician shall certify in writing, over his signature, as to the contestant's physical condition to engage in such contest.

(15a) The commission is authorized to grant licenses upon application and the payment of \* \* \* *the fees herein prescribed to matchmakers, managers, referees, examining physicians, boxers and seconds and trainers. The fees to be paid per annum shall be as follows: matchmakers in cities with a population of over one hundred fifty thousand, fifty dollars; matchmakers in other cities and in villages and towns, twenty-five dollars; managers, fifteen dollars; referees, fifteen dollars; examining physicians, ten dollars; boxers, ten dollars; seconds and trainers, ten dollars. The commission may revoke any such license \* \* \* upon such cause as \* \* \* it shall deem sufficient.*

(15b) *All referees shall be bona fide residents of the state. The referee must stop the contest or match when either of the contestants shows a marked superiority or is apparently outclassed.*

SECTION 4. A new subsection is added to section 20.61 of the statutes; a new subsection is added to section 20.19 of the statutes; a new section 20.051 to the statutes; two new subsections to section 20.20 of the statutes; a new paragraph to subsection (2) and a new paragraph to subsection (11) of section 20.38 of the statutes; and a new section 20.712 to the statutes to read: (20.61) (8) Annually, beginning July 1, 1925, five hundred dollars to the central Wisconsin cheesemakers', buttermakers' and dairymen's advancement association, for printing and otherwise carrying on its work.

(20.19) (4) Annually, beginning July 1, 1925, five hundred dollars for the execution of their functions.

20.051 The state treasurer shall collect the license fees provided for in subsection (29) of section 165.01 of the statutes and deposit the money so collected in the general fund.

(20.20) (6a) There is appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1925, and for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1926, twenty-five thousand dollars to effect the purposes authorized by section 24.075 of the statutes out of any moneys in the revolving fund provided for by subsection (6) of section 20.20 of the statutes.

(20.20) (9) All moneys received by the conservation commission from the receipts of the operation of the launches at Devils Lake as provided in subsection (6) of section 27.01 of the statutes shall be paid within one week of receipt into the conservation fund and are appropriated to the state conservation commission for carrying out the provisions of said subsection.

(20.38) (2) (j) The state board of normal regents are authorized on behalf and as an agent of a faculty-student organization, known as the stationers stand of the Oshkosh state normal school, to file claims with the federal government for supplies furnished at the request of the federal government to federal rehabilitation board students, lawfully assigned for instruction at the Oshkosh state normal school, and to pay any moneys received from the federal government on account of such claims direct to the lawful representatives of such faculty-student organization of the Oshkosh state normal school, the provisions of section 20.78 of the statutes to the contrary notwithstanding.

(20.38) (11) (af) On July 1, 1925, ten thousand five hundred seven dollars, and on July 1, 1926, five thousand five hundred eighty-two dollars, for property repairs and maintenance. Of the amount appropriated on July 1, 1925, three hundred forty-four dollars and forty-one cents may be paid for bills heretofore incurred for repairs on steam conduits, steam pump and hot water boiler.

20.712 There is appropriated from the general fund to the state civil service commission, on July 1, 1925, forty dollars to pay bills heretofore incurred. Any balance in this appropriation on January 1, 1926, shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 5. The prohibition commissioner is authorized to pay from the appropriation provided for by section 20.126 of the stat-

utes a bill for laboratory supplies amounting to fifty-two dollars and eighty-three cents heretofore incurred.

SECTION 6. There is appropriated from the general fund to the senate a sum sufficient, not exceeding five thousand dollars, for the payment of reporters and other necessary expenses of the special committees appointed pursuant to senate resolutions No. 20 and No. 25. Such money shall be paid by the state treasurer on the warrant of the secretary of state issued upon a requisition signed by the chairman of the committee incurring such expense, accompanied by a certificate showing for what purpose the money is to be paid and that the same has been approved by a majority of such committee. No expenditures hereunder shall be incurred after the sine die adjournment of the present session of the legislature.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect July 1, 1925.
