### CHAPTER 246.

AN ACT to amend paragraph (d) of subsection (5) of section 62.23 of the statutes, relating to city planning.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (5) of section 62.23 of the statutes is amended to read: (62.23) (5) (d) The continued use of a building or premise for an industry or use for which the same are *lawfully* used at the time any ordinance under this subsection shall take effect, shall not be prohibited, but alteration of or additions to buildings for the purpose of prohibited industry or use may be forbidden.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 247.

AN ACT to create subsection (28) of section 60.29 of the statutes, relating to power of town boards in certain counties to improve highways and streets and levy special assessments to pay for such improvements.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 60.29 of the statutes to read: (60.29) (28) The town board of every town in counties having a population of two hundred and fifty thousand

or more may cause the whole or any part of any street, highway or alley located therein to be graded, paved, macadamized or otherwise improved, including the construction of curbs and gutters, water and sewer mains and service pipes, or either, and levy special assessments therefor in the manner provided in chapter 61 of the statutes for villages located in similar counties but without any petition therefor as mentioned in subsection (26.)

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 248.

AN ACT to amend the introductory paragraph of section 27.05 and section 27.06 of the statutes, relating to county park commissions.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The introductory paragraph of section 27.05 and section 27.06 of the statutes are amended to read: (27.05) (Introductory paragraph) The said commission shall have charge and supervision of all county parks, and all lands heretofore or hereafter acquired by the county for park or reservation purposes; and shall have power *subject to the general supervision of the county board and to such regulations as it may prescribe:*

27.06 The county board \* \* \* *may* annually, at the same time that other county taxes are levied, levy a tax upon the taxable property of such county of one-tenth of a mill upon each dollar of the assessed valuation of the taxable property upon which other county taxes are levied and collected, *provided that a larger levy may be made for this purpose in counties having a population of two hundred and fifty thousand or more.* \* \* \* The entire amount of such special tax shall be collected as other taxes are collected and paid into the county treasury as a separate and distinct fund, to be paid out only upon the order of the county park commission for the purchase of land and the payment of expenses incurred in carrying on the work of the commission. Any part of said fund, except five thousand dollars
