## CHAPTER 427.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) and (2) of section 20.01 of the statutes, relating to the compensation of members of the legislature and making an appropriation.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 20.01 of the statutes are amended to read: (20.01) (1) Compensation and mileage to each member of the legislature, as \* \* \* follows:

(a) *One hundred dollars per month, payable monthly.*

(b) *For each special or regular session, mileage at the rate of ten cents per mile for every mile travelled in going to and returning from the state capitol on the most usual route.*

(2) To the speaker of the assembly, for his services as speaker, \* \* \* *twenty-five dollars per month, payable monthly*, in addition to his compensation and mileage as a member.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the first month following sine die adjournment of the 1929 regular session of the legislature.

## CHAPTER 428.

AN ACT to amend sections 20.37 and 20.38 and subsection (8) of section 37.11 of the statutes, relating to the appropriations for the state normal schools.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Sections 20.37 and 20.38 and subsection (8) of section 37.11 of the statutes are amended to read: 20.37 GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS TO THE NORMAL SCHOOL FUND INCOME. There is appropriated from the general fund to the normal school fund income:

(1) On July 1, 1925, three hundred twelve thousand five hundred dollars, and on July 1, 1926, two hundred seventy-five thousand dollars to meet the appropriations made by \* \* \* par-

agraph \* \* \* (d) of subsection (6), \* \* \* and paragraph (h) of subsection (9) of section 20.38 of the statutes.

(2) From time to time as needed and as approved by the \* \* \* *budget director*, an amount not to exceed \* \* \* *eight hundred \* \* \* sixty-five* thousand dollars for the fiscal year beginning July 1, \* \* \* *1929*, and an amount not to exceed \* \* \* *eight hundred \* \* \* sixty* thousand \* \* \* dollars for the fiscal year beginning July 1, \* \* \* *1930*.

(4) On July 1, 1927, one hundred ninety-nine thousand five hundred dollars, and on July 1, 1928, one hundred ten thousand five hundred ninety-five dollars to meet the appropriations made by paragraph \* \* \* (d) of subsection (4), paragraph \* \* \* (d) of subsection (5), paragraph \* \* \* (e) of subsection (6), paragraph (d) \* \* \* of subsection (7), and paragraph (e) of subsection (9), \* \* \* all of section 20.38 of the statutes.

(5) On \* \* \* July 1, 1918, one hundred twenty-three thousand dollars to meet the appropriations from the normal school fund income made by \* \* \* paragraph (e) of subsection (9), \* \* \* of section 20.38.

(6) *On July 1, 1929, two hundred seventy-two thousand three hundred dollars, and on July 1, 1930, two hundred thousand dollars to meet the appropriations from the normal school fund income made by paragraph (d) of subsection (2), paragraph (d) of subsection (4), paragraph (e) of subsection (6), paragraph (d) of subsection (8), and paragraph (e) of subsection 11, all of section 20.38 of the statutes.*

20.38 APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE NORMAL SCHOOL FUND INCOME. There is appropriated from the normal school fund income to the board of normal school regents:

(1) BOARD OF NORMAL REGENTS. For the board of normal regents, annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* *1929*, \* \* \* *twenty-six* thousand \* \* \* dollars for the execution of the functions of said board. Of this there is allotted:

(a) To each member of said board such compensation as may be fixed by the board for rendering any specific service under the direction of the board; but they shall receive no compensation for time spent in going to, attending, or returning from the meetings of the board.

(c) No part of this appropriation shall be used for salaries, compensations, or traveling expenses of any persons or officials other than members of the board of normal regents, the secretary of the board, the business agent, the physician, the accountant, and stenographers, except that not to exceed three hundred fifty dollars, annually, may be used for small administrative expenses, for investigations of the several normal schools, including the traveling expenses of teachers for conferences relating to questions of administration of the normal schools.

(d) Annually, beginning July 1, 1917, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of the annual audit as provided in section 37.08.

\* \* \*

(2) NORMAL SCHOOLS IN GENERAL. For any or all of the normal schools under the supervision of the state board of normal school regents, to be distributed as the said board may direct:

(a) \* \* \* *Annually*, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, fifteen thousand dollars for operation of summer school only.

(b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *fifty* thousand dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *fifty* thousand dollars for additional operation, including teachers' salaries.

(c) On March 1, 1915, ninety thousand dollars for the purchase of land and for land improvements at the several normal schools in sums allotted, as follows: For the normal school at Oshkosh, thirty-one thousand dollars.

(d) *On July 1, 1929, one hundred ninety-four thousand seven hundred fifty dollars, and on July 1, 1930, two hundred thousand dollars for the construction and equipment of new buildings and other permanent property and improvements. No part of this appropriation shall be effective and available for any project until approval in writing signed by the governor and at least one other member of the emergency board has been filed in the office of the secretary of state.*

\* \* \* (g) The board of normal regents shall have the power and authority to regulate the allotment for salaries of teachers at the various normal schools, and to make such transfers of allotments for salaries of teachers among the normal schools as it shall find proper and necessary. It shall also have the power and authority to make transfers from legislative appropriations for operation other than salaries of teachers not to

exceed ten per cent of the appropriation for operation exclusive of salaries of teachers.

(h) All moneys received by the board of regents for normal schools on account of grants made by the United States government for specific services rendered by any normal school or normal schools, and all moneys received by said board from private gifts, shall be paid, within one week after receipt, into the normal fund income and are appropriated therefrom, to carry out the purposes of such grants and gifts in accordance with the conditions under which the same are made.

\* \* \*

(3) EAU CLAIRE NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at Eau Claire:

(a) Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *thirty-one* thousand \* \* \* *nine* hundred \* \* \* *seventy-five* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *one hundred* thousand \* \* \* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *six* thousand \* \* \* *seven hundred twenty-five* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *six* thousand \* \* \* *seven hundred* \* \* \* *twenty-five* dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *twenty-two* thousand \* \* \* *one hundred* \* \* \* *fifty* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *thirteen* thousand seven hundred fifty dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

\* \* \*

(4) LA CROSSE NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at La Crosse:

(a) Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *forty-one* thousand \* \* \* *four* hundred \* \* \* *fifty* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, *one hundred* \* \* \* *thirty-nine* thousand \* \* \* *three* hundred *three* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* eight thousand five hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* eight thousand one hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* thirteen thousand \* \* \* seven hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* thirteen thousand \* \* \* six hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

\* \* \* (d) On July 1, 1927, twenty-one thousand dollars, and on July 1, 1929, forty-four thousand dollars for the construction and equipment of \* \* \* an addition to the gymnasium.

\* \* \*

(5) MILWAUKEE NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at Milwaukee:

(a) \* \* \* Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* fifty-five thousand \* \* \* four hundred \* \* \* eighty-five dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and \* \* \* annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, two hundred \* \* \* forty-seven thousand nine hundred ten dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* nine thousand \* \* \* seven hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* eight thousand \* \* \* seven hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, thirteen thousand \* \* \* four hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* twelve thousand \* \* \* three hundred \* \* \* dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

\* \* \* (d) On July 1, 1927, six thousand dollars to change the present electric service, build transformers, change present

D. C. motors to A. C. motors, and make necessary changes in switches, wiring, and switchboard to effect the change to a primary rate.

(6) OSHKOSH NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at Oshkosh:

(a) \* \* \* *Annually*, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *forty-four* thousand \* \* \* *five* hundred \* \* \* *fifty* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and \* \* \* *annually*, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, one hundred \* \* \* *seventy-six* thousand \* \* \* *fifty* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *fourteen* thousand \* \* \* *four* hundred dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *fourteen* thousand \* \* \* *four* hundred dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, eighteen thousand *one hundred* \* \* \* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *eighteen* thousand \* \* \* *one* hundred \* \* \* dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

\* \* \* (d) On July 1, 1925, twenty-five thousand dollars for the purchase of land as a site for the new school building, adjacent to the present normal school site. \* \* \* Any money received from the sale of buildings now on the Sinclair Mainland property shall be paid within one week into the normal school fund income, and is appropriated therefrom to the normal board for land improvements on said property.

\* \* \* (e) On July 1, 1927, eighty thousand dollars, and on July 1, 1929, *three thousand three hundred* dollars for the construction and equipment of a new central heating plant, including connections with all buildings and any remodeling of steam conduits, equipment and piping, and changes of such motors and electric connections as are advisable in the present buildings and on the grounds of said school necessary to the effective operation of the heating plant, *provided that seven hundred five dollars may be used for bills incurred prior to June 1, 1929;*

\* \* \* and thirty-five thousand dollars for furniture, furnishings and fixtures at the new training school building.

(7) PLATTEVILLE NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at Platteville:

(a) Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *thirty-three* thousand \* \* \* *eight* hundred \* \* \* *fifty* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *one* hundred thousand \* \* \* *nine* hundred *twenty* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *fourteen* thousand \* \* \* *eight* hundred \* \* \* *twenty-five* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, fourteen thousand \* \* \* *seven* hundred \* \* \* *seventy-five* dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *twenty-two* thousand \* \* \* *six* hundred \* \* \* *eighty* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *twelve* thousand *nine* hundred *ninety-five* \* \* \* dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

(d) On \* \* \* July 1, 1927, twenty thousand dollars for the purchase of land.

\* \* \*

(8) RIVER FALLS NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at River Falls:

(a) Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *thirty-six* thousand \* \* \* *five* hundred \* \* \* *twenty* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, one hundred \* \* \* *twenty-two* thousand \* \* \* *four* hundred *fifteen* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *six* thousand three hundred \* \* \* *fifty* dollars, and on July 1,

\* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *six thousand* \* \* \* *one hundred* \* \* \* *fifty* dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *fifteen thousand* \* \* \* *two hundred* \* \* \* *fifty* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *fifteen thousand* \* \* \* *six hundred* \* \* \* *fifty* dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

(d) On July 1, 1929, *twenty-five thousand dollars* for the construction and equipment of a workshop.

(9) STEVENS POINT NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at Stevens Point:

(a) Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *thirty-nine thousand* \* \* \* *forty* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, one hundred \* \* \* *twenty-four thousand* \* \* \* *one hundred forty* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *twelve thousand* \* \* \* *five hundred* \* \* \* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *thirteen thousand* \* \* \* *five hundred* \* \* \* *forty* dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *twenty-five thousand two hundred* \* \* \* *thirty-five* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *eleven thousand* \* \* \* *three hundred* \* \* \* *seventy-five* dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

(e) On March 1, 1919, *twenty-five thousand dollars*, and on July 1, 1928, *forty-five thousand five hundred ninety-five dollars* for the construction and equipment of the new school building as provided for in paragraph (h) of this subsection; and on July 1, 1928, *sixty-five thousand dollars* for a new boiler plant, necessary equipment, and connections with other buildings.

(h) On July 1, 1925, *seventy-five thousand dollars*, and on July 1, 1926, *seventy-five thousand dollars* for the construction of a new school building.

(10) SUPERIOR NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at Superior:

(a) Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *thirty-nine* thousand \* \* \* *nine* hundred \* \* \* *fifty-five* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, one hundred \* \* \* *fifty-six* thousand \* \* \* *one* hundred *forty-five* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *thirty-four* thousand \* \* \* *six* hundred fifty dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *fourteen* thousand \* \* \* *six* hundred fifty dollars for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *fourteen* thousand \* \* \* *seven* hundred \* \* \* dollars, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *fourteen* thousand \* \* \* *seven* hundred \* \* \* dollars for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

\* \* \*

(g) Annually, for three years, beginning July 1, 1919, nine thousand dollars \* \* \* for the purchase of land, provided that any amount or amounts received from the sale of buildings on the land purchased with funds derived from this appropriation, shall be added to this appropriation and available for the same purpose; provided further that no part of this appropriation shall be used as a down payment, or part payment on the purchase of land, but only for acquiring the full legal title in fee, without lien or incumbrance.

(11) WHITEWATER NORMAL SCHOOL. For the normal school at Whitewater:

(a) Annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, *thirty-seven* thousand \* \* \* *five* hundred \* \* \* *seventy-five* dollars for operation other than teachers' salaries; and annually, beginning July 1, \* \* \* 1929, one hundred \* \* \* *twenty-nine* thousand \* \* \* *one* hundred *ten* dollars for teachers' salaries only.

(ab) Annually, beginning July 1, 1923, an amount sufficient to cover the cost of insurance; and the cost of coal and other solid

fuel purchased pursuant to section 34.02 of the statutes, including freight charges and local hauling charges thereon.

\* \* \* (b) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *twelve thousand \* \* \* six hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars*, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *eleven thousand \* \* \* six hundred \* \* \* fifty dollars* for property repairs and maintenance.

\* \* \* (c) On July 1, \* \* \* 1929, \* \* \* *eleven thousand \* \* \* eight hundred thirty-seven dollars*, and on July 1, \* \* \* 1930, \* \* \* *ten thousand \* \* \* five hundred \* \* \* twenty-five dollars* for permanent property and improvements, except purchase of land.

(e) *On July 1, 1929, five thousand two hundred fifty dollars for the purchase of land, permanent property and improvements.*

(f) On \* \* \* July 1, 1921, twenty-five thousand seven hundred seventy-nine dollars for completing and equipping the power and heating plant and connecting the plant with the school buildings by conduits and necessary piping. *Of the balance remaining in this appropriation on July 1, 1929, three thousand three hundred dollars shall be reverted to the fund from which appropriated.*

(12) DORMITORIES AND OTHER AUXILIARIES. For dormitories and dining halls, cafeterias, stationery stands, and music departments at normal schools, as follows:

(a) On July 1, 1915, one thousand five hundred dollars, to be used as a revolving appropriation for the operation and maintenance of and the purchase of necessary equipment for the dormitory and dining hall at the normal school at Oshkosh; and all moneys collected or received by each and every person, for or on account of said dormitory and dining hall, shall be paid within one week of receipt into the normal school fund income, and are appropriated and added to this appropriation.

(b) On July 1, 1916, one thousand five hundred dollars, to be used as a revolving appropriation for the operation and maintenance of and the purchase of necessary equipment for the dormitory and dining hall at the normal school at Stevens Point; and all moneys collected or received by each and every person for or on account of said dormitory and dining hall, shall be paid within one week of receipt into the normal school fund income, and are appropriated and added to this appropriation.

(c) All moneys collected or received by each and every person, for or on account of the dormitory and dining room hall at the normal school at Superior, shall be paid within one week of receipt into the normal school fund income, and are appropriated to be used as a revolving appropriation for the operation and maintenance of and the purchase of necessary equipment for said dormitory and dining hall.

(d) All moneys collected or received by each and every person for or on account of the music department, stationery stand, and cafeteria at the normal school at Milwaukee, shall be paid within one week of receipt into the normal school fund income, and are appropriated to be used as revolving appropriations, respectively, for the operation and maintenance of and the purchase of necessary equipment for said music department, stationery stand, and cafeteria.

(e) The board of normal regents may establish and operate cafeterias and stationery stands at any of the normal schools; and all moneys collected or received by each and every person, for or on account of any such cafeteria, or stationery stand, shall be paid, within one week of receipt, into the normal school fund income, and are appropriated, to be used as revolving appropriations, respectively, for the operation and maintenance of and the purchase of necessary equipment for each such cafeteria or stationery stand.

(f) No part of any appropriation for operation of normal schools shall be expended or available for appropriations provided for by this subsection, except paragraph (h) thereof.

(g) The board of normal regents may establish and operate model farms in connection with any department for the training of teachers of agriculture at the normal schools at River Falls and Platteville. All moneys collected or received by each and every person for or on account of the activities connected with any such model farm, shall be paid, within one week after receipt, into the normal school fund income, and are appropriated therefrom, to carry out the provisions of this paragraph.

(j) *The board of normal regents may establish at any or all normal schools a contingent fund not to exceed five hundred dollars out of the balances in cafeteria and dining hall revolving funds to be used for the payment of expenses which must be met by payment of cash in advance and which are incident to the operation of such cafeterias and dining halls.*

(13) SUMMER SCHOOLS. Summer schools for teachers shall be limited to six weeks in each year. For all fiscal purposes, the entire summer session shall be considered as occurring in the fiscal year in which the major part thereof occurs, and all expenditures therefor shall be charged to the appropriation for such fiscal year; provided that bills for printing incurred prior to the beginning of such fiscal year may be paid out of current funds, and replaced at the beginning of such fiscal year.

(37.11) (8) To require any applicant for admission, \* \* \* *who shall not have been exempted by any of the provisions of this section, to pay or to secure to be paid such fees for tuition as the board may deem proper and reasonable. \* \* \* The board may also charge any student laboratory fees, book rents, fees for special departments or an incidental fee covering all such special costs. Any student who shall have been a resident of the state for one year next preceding his first admission to a normal school or any minor student whose parents have been bona fide residents of this state for one year next preceding the beginning of any semester for which such student enters a normal school shall, while he continues a resident of the state, be entitled to exemption from fees for tuition but not from incidental fees in the normal school. Any student who shall not have been a resident of the state for one year next preceding his first admission to a normal school, except as above provided, shall not be exempt from the payment of the tuition fees until he shall have attended a normal school for four academic years; but if he shall have attended a normal school and thereafter shall continuously have been a resident of this state for a period of combined attendance at a normal school and subsequent residence in the state of not less than four years, he shall, while he continues a resident of the state, be entitled to exemption from payment of tuition fees upon reentering a normal school.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
