**CHAPTER 349.**

AN ACT to amend 29.135 (1) of the statutes, relating to licenses for wholesale fish markets.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

29.135 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.135 (1) Every person who deals in fish by operating a wholesale fish market or fish house shall secure a license from the state conservation commission, subject to the provisions of section 29.09. Every license shall expire on December 31, and the fee for such license is \$25. *For the purpose of this section all persons who purchase fish and sell them to anyone other than a consumer shall be considered a wholesale dealer. This includes all fish other than fish that are cooked in cans and ready for table use, or pickled fish, or fish meal.*

**CHAPTER 350.**

AN ACT to amend 103.23 (2), 103.67 (2) and 103.71 (2) of the statutes, relating to the age limit of boys employed in street trades.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 103.23 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

103.23 (2) No boy under 13 years of age shall be employed or permitted to work at any time in any street trade; except that boys under 13 years of age who have street trade permits and badges issued prior to the enactment of this section may continue their employment in street trades. *For the duration of the present war and until its termination as proclaimed by the President or the Congress of the United States and for 6 months thereafter, the industrial commission, in its discretion, may issue permits to boys to engage in house to house street trades in residential areas when such boys have reached the age of 12 years.*

SECTION 2. 103.67 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

103.67 (2) No minor under fourteen years of age shall be employed, or permitted to work in any gainful occupation at any time; except that minors under fourteen may be employed in agricultural pursuits as provided in section 103.77, and minors from twelve to fourteen may be employed during school vacations as provided in subsection (3) of this section and in public exhibitions as provided in section 103.78, and that boys of thirteen may be employed in street trades, *and boys of twelve may be employed in house to house street trades*, as provided in sections 103.21 to 103.36.

SECTION 3. 103.71 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

103.71 (2) No permit shall be issued authorizing the employment of any minor under fourteen years at any time; except for minors twelve years and over to appear in public exhibitions as provided in section 103.78 and for boys thirteen years of age in street trades, *and for boys twelve years of age in house to house street trades*, as provided in sections 103.21 to 103.31.

### CHAPTER 351.

AN ACT to amend 19.01 (7) and 330.20 (2) of the statutes, relating to bonds of public officials and employes.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 19.01 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

19.01 (7) This section shall not be construed as requiring any particular officer to furnish or file either an official oath or an official bond. It is applicable to such officers only as are elsewhere in these statutes or by the constitution *or by special, private or local law* required to furnish such an oath or bond. Provided, however, that whether otherwise required by law or not, an oath of office shall be filed by every member of any board or commission appointed by the governor, and by every administrative officer so appointed, also by every secretary and other chief executive officer appointed by such board or commission.
