for assignment regarding the termination of such joint tenancy, tenancy by the entirety, or life estate and regarding such other facts as are essential to a full and final determination of the rights of the parties interested.

## CHAPTER 287.

AN ACT to renumber 20.20 (Introductory paragraph) to be 20.20 (1) and 20.20 (1) to be 20.20 (2); and to amend 29.60 (1) of the statutes, relating to bounties on wild animals and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 20.20 (Introductory paragraph) of the statutes is renumbered 20.20 (1).

Section 2. 20.20 (1) of the statutes, created by chapter 5, laws of 1945, is renumbered 20.20 (2).

Section 3. 29.60 (1) of the statutes, as amended by chapter 5, laws of 1945, is amended to read:

29.60 (1) Any person who shall kill any wolf or covote cub between March 1 and September 1 next following shall be entitled to a reward of \$10, or any mature wolf or coyote at any time \$20, or any wildcat \$5, or any lynx \$5, to be paid out of the state treasury under the provisions of section 20.205 (1); any person who shall kill any red or gray fox kit between March 1 and September 1 next following shall be entitled to a reward of \$1, or any mature red or gray fox at any time \$2.50, \* \* \* to be paid out of the state treasury under the provisions of section 20.205 (1) \* \* \*. At the end of each fiscal year the conservation fund shall reimburse the general fund for one-half of all bounties paid for red or gray fox under this subsection during such fiscal year. Where a wolf, coyote or fox while being chased by dogs belonging to one person, is killed by another person, the bounty shall be divided equally between such persons. There shall be no payment made on unborn pups or kits.
