CHAPTER 1.

AN ACT to repeal 20.01 (6) (d) and to amend 20.01 (6) (a) of the statutes, relating to the assignment of an assembly legislative clerk as a voting machine operator and his salary, a cost of living bonus for legislative employes and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 20.01 (6) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

20.01 (6) (a) Twelve legislative clerks, who shall assist the chief clerk in maintaining the official records of proceedings of the assembly, index, revise and enroll bills, maintain mailing lists, and perform such other work as may be required, \$7 per day. Two of said clerks shall be assigned to the revising and enrolling of bills and shall have some knowledge of and experience in proof reading as evidenced by such tests as the bureau of personnel may require *and one of whom shall be assigned to the operation of the voting machine and who shall receive \$1 a day more than the amount stipulated for legislative clerks in this paragraph.*

SECTION 2. 20.01 (6) (d) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the general fund to the legislature for the 1951 regular session and, as to clerks detailed for service during such period under section 13.14 (6) for 30 days thereafter, or any special session intervening between the 1951 and 1953 regular sessions, a sum sufficient to provide a cost of living bonus to each legislative employe, as follows: \$1.50 per calendar day to each employe paid from the appropriations made under section 20.01 (2) (b), (2m) (b), (5) (a), (b), (c), (6) (a), (b), (c), (e), (7) (a), (b), (8) (a), (b) and (9) of the statutes. Such bonus shall be paid monthly and shall be computed from the effective date of this section. The proper certification officer shall monthly certify to the department of budget and accounts the amount due each such employe under this section and the director of budget and accounts shall draw his warrant for the amount so certified for each such employe.
