CHAPTER 353.

AN ACT to create 40.374 (10) of the statutes, relating to state aids to counties on high school pupils enrolled in out of state high schools.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

40.374 (10) of the statutes is created to read:

40.374 (10) STATE AID ON HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS WHO ATTEND OUT-OF-STATE SCHOOLS.

Upon making payment of high school tuition to out-of-state school districts, the county

clerk shall make application to the state superintendent for state aids on forms provided by the department of public instruction. The state superintendent shall upon receipt of such application, and upon having satisfied himself of the correctness of same, shall certify the claim for payment in the same manner and from the same appropriation as aids are certified and paid to school districts. The provisions of this act shall apply to claims during the 1946-1947 school year and all succeeding years.

The amount of such aid received by any county in any year shall be applied to the next payment of high school tuition, and the amount to be levied on the tuition-paying area of the county reduced accordingly in the next tax levy.
