CHAPTER 5.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 551, private and local laws of 1866, as amended by chapter 310, private and local laws of 1871, chapter 81, private and local laws of 1872, chapter 74, laws of 1877, chapter 238, laws of 1883, and chapter 249, laws of 1897, and to create and establish a common school district in the city of Monroe and the town of Monroe, Green county, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 551, private and local laws of 1866, authorizing a union school district in the village (now city) and town of Monroe, in the county of Green, as amended by chapter 310, private and local laws of 1871, chapter 81, private and local laws of 1872, chapter 74, laws of 1877, chapter 238, laws of 1883, and chapter 249, laws of 1897, is repealed.

SECTION 2. The following described territory in the city of Monroe and the town of Monroe, Green county, Wisconsin, said territory heretofore being constituted and known as "Union School District Number One of the City of Monroe" under chapter 551, private and local laws of 1866, as amended, herein repealed, to wit:

"All of sections twenty-six, thirty-four, thirty-five, and the east half and southwest quarter of section twenty-seven, of town two north, of range seven east; also lots numbered one, two, three, four, five, six, eleven, and twelve, of section number two, and lots numbered one, two, three, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, and eleven of section number three, all in town one north, of range seven east; also the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section number thirty-six, in town number two north, of range seven east, in the town of Monroe, Green county, Wisconsin";

together with all other territory now included within the corporate limits of the city of Monroe, is hereby constituted and organized as a common school district to be known as "Joint School District Number One of the City of Monroe and Part of the Town of Monroe".

SECTION 3. The school district created herein shall derive its corporate powers from the general laws of the state of Wisconsin, shall be subject to all Wisconsin statutes now in force or as hereafter amended pertaining to common school districts, and shall possess all the rights, powers, and privileges of common school districts in this state.

SECTION 4. All the assets and liabilities of Union School District Number One of the City of Monroe are hereby made the assets and liabilities of Joint School District Number One of the City of Monroe and Part of the Town of Monroe.

SECTION 5. The board of said district shall consist of seven members. The officers presently serving as president, secretary, and treasurer of Union School District Number

One of the City of Monroe shall hold the offices of director, clerk, and treasurer, respectively, of the district herein created. The members presently serving as commissioners of Union School District Number One of the City of Monroe shall be members of the board of the district herein created. Each officer and member above specified shall continue in office until the second Monday in July of each of the years as follows and until his successor has been elected or appointed and qualified:

At the expiration of the term of each such officer or member, his successor shall be elected for the term and in the manner specified by the general laws of this state governing common school districts.

SECTION 6. The school district herein created and its district board is hereby authorized to operate and maintain the high school heretofore operated and maintained by Union School District No. 1 of the City of Monroe. If the provisions of this section shall be held invalid, the remainder of this act shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
