**CHAPTER 323**

AN ACT to renumber and amend 6.17 (2); to renumber 10.15 (1); to amend 6.185 (4) (c); and to create 6.17 (2) (b), 6.185 (4) (d) and 10.15 (1) (b) of the statutes, relating to registration by disabled electors.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 6.17 (2) of the statutes is renumbered 6.17 (2) (a) and amended to read:

6.17 (2) (a) *Except as otherwise provided herein*, applications for registration shall be made in person by the elector who shall be required to sign the original and duplicate affidavits.

SECTION 2. 6.17 (2) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

6.17 (2) (b) Affidavits of registration of any qualified elector confined to his home or in any institution because of physical illness or infirmity may be filled-in and sworn to at the home of such elector or in the institution where he is confined, before the municipal clerk or other authorized employe of his office.

SECTION 3. 6.185 (4) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

6.185 (4) (c) *Except as otherwise provided herein*, the clerk of the municipality shall receive applications for registration at his office during regular office hours throughout the year, and at such other places and at such times as he may deem advisable, except that registration for any election or primary shall be closed at 5 p.m. central time on the second Wednesday next preceding the election or primary.

SECTION 4. 6.185 (4) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

6.185 (4) (d) Affidavits of registration of any qualified elector confined to his home or in any institution because of physical illness or infirmity may be filled-in and sworn to at the home of such elector or institution, before the municipal clerk or other authorized employe of his office.

SECTION 5. 10.15 (1) of the statutes is renumbered 10.15 (1) (a).

SECTION 6. 10.15 (1) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

10.15 (1) (b) Affidavits of registration of any qualified elector confined to his home or in any institution because of physical illness or infirmity may be filled-in and sworn to at the home of such elector or institution, before the secretary or other authorized employe of the board of election commissioners.
