CHAPTER 432

AN ACT to create 347.26 (8) of the statutes, relating to warning lamps on vehicles used for rural mail delivery.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

347.26 (8) of the statutes is created to read:

347.26 (8) WARNING LAMPS FOR RURAL MAIL DELIVERY VEHICLES. Any vehicle used for rural mail delivery may be equipped with a flashing amber lamp mounted above the top line of the windshield and showing to the front and rear so as to warn other motorists that the operator of the vehicle is stopped or about to stop to deliver mail or is preparing to resume operation on the highway after having stopped to deliver mail. Such lamp may be used only for the purpose specified in this subsection.
