**CHAPTER 440**

AN ACT to create 29.513 of the statutes, relating to management of fish populations in lakes.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

29.513 of the statutes is created to read:

**29.513 PERMIT FOR PRIVATE MANAGEMENT.** (1) Any person or persons owning all of the land bordering on any navigable lake that is completely landlocked may apply to the commission for a permit to remove, destroy or introduce fish in such lake.

(2) Upon receiving such application the commission shall hold a public hearing in the vicinity of such lake, and if the hearing is favorable

the commission may issue a permit authorizing the applicant to remove, destroy or introduce fish in such lake.

(3) Such permit shall be subject to such terms, conditions and limitations as the commission deems proper. All work done under the authority of such permit shall be under the supervision of the commission or its agents, who shall be afforded free access to such lake at all times for such purpose by the permittee. The expenses of such supervision shall be paid by the permittee.

(4) All fish removed from such lake under such permit shall be turned over to the commission.
