**CHAPTER 218**

**AN ACT** to amend 10.04 (4) (a) of the statutes, relating to qualifications of inspectors and ballot clerks in cities containing more than 200,000 population.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

10.04 (4) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

10.04 (4) (a) Inspectors and ballot clerks shall be citizens of the United States; shall be of good repute and character; able to read and

write the English language; be of good understanding and capable. They must reside in the ward for which they are selected to act, *except if a vacancy occurs requiring appointment under sub. (6), in cases of emergency or because of time limitation they may reside in an adjoining ward,* be entitled to vote therein at the next election and not hold any other public office, except notary public, and shall not be a candidate for any public office while acting as inspectors or ballot clerks.
