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CHAPTER 517

AN ACT relating to appropriating a sum of money from the general fund to persons named therein for payment of claims made by them against the state.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund \$685.91 to William K. Chipman to compensate him for salary earned and travel expenses incurred as director of civil defense for the state of Wisconsin for the period March 9, 1961, to March 27, 1961, inclusive, during which period of time he served in his official capacity but had failed to file his official oath. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 2. The claim of Doering Motor Company to compensate it for damages sustained on March 15 and 16, 1960, to a number of automobiles stored in a building at State Fair Park and resultant costs incurred from the collapse of a portion of the roof is allowed in the amount of \$14,584.84 and shall be paid from the appropriation made by section 20.140 (61), 1959 statutes. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the general fund \$150 to Evans Brothers and Burrs, Inc., to compensate it for damages to a store window by a rotary mower operated on the grounds of Oshkosh State College on October 12, 1960. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the general fund \$74.68 to George P. Graberec to compensate him for damages suffered from an accident on July 28, 1960, when a sewer line maintained by the state on the

claimant's farm collapsed under his tractor. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 5. There is appropriated from the general fund \$1,341 to Robert B. Heywood for services rendered to the 1959 Assembly Rules and Manual Revision Committee. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim for such services.

SECTION 6. There is appropriated from the general fund \$300 to Waneeta Holmes to compensate her for injuries suffered on October 6, 1960, on a temporary boardwalk on the grounds of the Central Wisconsin Colony and Training School. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 7. There is appropriated from the general fund \$645.49 to Margaret H. Loisselle to compensate her for damages suffered in a fall on a wet floor at the Wisconsin Center Building on September 18, 1960. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 8. There is appropriated from the general fund \$755.50 to Milk Transport, Inc., to compensate it for damages resulting from a collision on January 10, 1960, between one of its vehicles and a cow belonging to the University of Wisconsin, which had strayed on the highway. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 9. There is appropriated from the general fund \$58 to the Mondovi Equity Cooperative Association to compensate it for damages resulting from the spilling of acid on the floor of the claimant by an employe of the State Department of Agriculture in 1960. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 10. There is appropriated from the general fund \$7,500 to Clinton Moreaux, Jr., to compensate him for damages suffered by him as an inmate of the Green Bay Reformatory while performing inmate labor on December 4, 1958, with insufficiently protected power equipment. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.

SECTION 11. The claim of Marie Stumpf to compensate her for medical expenses as a result of an accident at State Fair Park on August 22, 1953, and which are in addition to those for which she received compensation under chapter 677, laws of 1955, is allowed in the amount of \$2,143.73 and shall be paid from the appropriation made by section 20.140 (61), 1959 statutes. Acceptance of this payment shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such charge.
