**Chapter 613**

AN ACT appropriating a sum of money therein named to the state historical society for the biennium 1965-67 for the purpose of developing, preserving and protecting Wisconsin historic sites.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

There is appropriated from the general purpose revenues in the general fund to the state historical society for the biennium 1965-67 the sum of \$100,000 for the purpose of developing, preserving and protecting

Wisconsin historical sites. Of this appropriation there is allotted and shall be expended at least \$50,000 for the planning and construction of a building or buildings for the state carriage museum at Greenbush, Wisconsin to house all or part of the carriage collection of Wesley Jung of Sheboygan and other carriages and carriage collections of equal quality. The state historical society is authorized to expend the remainder of this appropriation for the purpose of improving a building or buildings on the grounds of or adjacent to the Villa Louis mansion in Prairie du Chien and for acquiring and developing lands needed to protect the circus world museum at Baraboo.
