Report of Joint Survey Committee on Tax Exemptions on  
Amendment 1, S. to Senate Bill 148

**Public Policy Involved**

The bill is undesirable as a matter of public policy since it is contrary to the ability to pay theory of the Wisconsin income tax law. Under this bill, a person with weekly earnings of \$105 could receive unemployment benefit payments of \$53 weekly for a maximum of 34 weeks without paying any income tax on these benefits. A person working a 40 hour week at the minimum wage of \$1.25 per hour would

earn \$50 a week, all of which would be subject to income taxation.
